INTRODUCTION

I. REJOICING IN THE GRACE OF THE GODHEAD

“Peter, an apostle of Jesus Christ, to those who are elect exiles of the Dispersion in Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia, and Bithynia, according to the foreknowledge of God the Father, in the sanctification of the Spirit, for obedience to Jesus Christ and for sprinkling with His blood: May grace and peace be multiplied to you.” (1 Peter 1:1-2)

1 Peter 5:1-2 -

3) As Peter opens his letter he identifies a glorious SPIRITUAL truth, a _____ TEMPORARY reality, and a comforting GEOGRAPHICAL fact to his readers (and to us!).

Note: Being called an “ELECT exile” emphasizes GOD’S _____ will, choice, and decision to love, save, and redeem a people for Himself (sinners just like us!).

1 Peter 2:9-10 -

Note: Being called an “*elect EXILE*” emphasizes that this world is NOT our _____; we are much more like “pioneers” rather than “settlers”; life is NOT easy for exiles, BUT this is a temporary condition!

1 Peter 2:11-12 -

Note: By emphasizing the “dispersed” nature of these believers and the five districts in which they lived, they can take great comfort in the fact that while they may be dispersed, they are not _____!

Acts 16:6-7 -

4) Peter explains that God the FATHER foreknows, God the SPIRIT sanctifies, and God the SON expects love-motivated-obedience from those He has _____ from sin.
